# Dyarubbin Exhibition & Library Excursion

Last Monday students visited the Dyarubbin Exhibition at the Hawkesbury Regional Gallery. This program links to the History unit - Community and Remembrance, that they have been studying this term.

While they were in Windsor students also visited the Hawkesbury Central Library to explore their collection and facilities.

Here's what they had to say about the excursion.....

#### Elza

On Monday we went to the Dyarubbin Exhibition. My favourite part was the colourful glass eels. The eels travelled a long way. The Dharug people believe that Gurungatty, the eel, created the rivers. I think it was very clever to make the glass and colourful eels.

On Monday we went to the Dyarubbin Exhibition Centre. We saw Aboriginal Art on the rock wall. The Aboriginal people carved in the cave. The Aboriginal people carved in the rock. We were interested in the Lego. We were at the Library in Windsor and we looked at the cool Lego truck and crane.

On Monday, my school friends and I went to the Hawkesbury Deerubbin Centre in Windsor.

The first place we went to was the Art Gallery. At the gallery was a special exhibition about indigenous people of this region, their culture, tools and stories. We saw all sorts of art. I especially liked how the pictures told a story just using drawings. The gallery also had indigenous tools like the Bula Guni which is also known as yam digging sticks. Yam digging sticks were only used by women. Every woman had different detailed yarn digging sticks. Yam sticks were used to dig up yams. Sometimes the yam sticks were used to fight. This method of fighting would probably be very effective because the sticks were made of hardwood and could give you a big donk on the head!


